Dear Sir/Madam,

Having severely restricted and interfered with the private and family life of my brother, mother and myself for the past two years, I suggest this application does not become part of the long list of neglect of our statutory rights, and indications of organisational or institutional abuse.

Please ensure adequate provision is made for support to be available for my brother to have a family home visit 5th August 2017, to arrive at [REDACTED] am and be picked up at [REDACTED] pm.

I request that he and his mother are not refused or denied of said visit and that suitable clothing is provided to him (to include an adequate and appropriate jacket or coat).

I request confirmation of the above via a generic, or role based email address from your organisation within 24 hours of receiving this email; and NOT a personal Priory Group email address.

I advise that my brother should have his assigned 1 to 1 carer available with medication and remain close by, although not required to stay with us at the property.

A work-related mobile contact number for said care should be provided, in the event of an emergency; something that has been neglected to be given to me for a considerable time, and to date. Should my brother's carer and a mobile number not be made available, I shall duly note the disregard of such for future redress.

The document named "H [REDACTED] H [REDACTED] family home visit restrictions.pdf." remains in effect and until further notice.
