Dear Mr Vickers,

Re: Mobile phone, concerns and continuation of inadequate care and support

Further to your letter of 12th April 2018 and my previous letter of 1st February 2018, in which I invited you to meet with my solicitor and me at their office at a mutually convenient day and time, which you declined.

I ingeminate, in consideration of your attempt to suppress our website and the threats made by your colleagues, including Ms S [REDACTED] in March 2017, the destruction of my family and severe restriction on our statutory rights, I again invite you to meet me at my solicitor's office at a mutually convenient day and time. Alternatively, I suggest Herefordshire Council progresses legal proceedings concerning the restrictions imposed on us and the constraints on my brother, mother and my statutory rights.

In the interim, I will continue to contact Herefordshire Council to arrange and facilitate family home visits for my brother. However, Priory Group staff will not be permitted at our home, and any required support from Herefordshire Council and alternative care agency provider should be available for our chosen meeting location, and home visits if needed or requested.

Further, no less than five months have passed since the adapted mobile phone my brother loaned was confiscated from him, it kept locked away denying him of contact with his family, without valid justification or in fact any factual evidence, nor was such institutional abuse challenged by Herefordshire Council or his RPR. Therefore I have now requested the phone be returned.

Mr R [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] will be collecting the phone and accessories on Tuesday 2nd May 2018 and, as agreed will be a witness along with a colleague to the claims made by The Priory Group staff regarding the phone. I will also examine the device physically and digitally on its return to me. A copy of the signed loan form is attached detailing the items to collect.

Regarding your desire to maintain my brother's current health and wellbeing, such ignorance to address continued concern is reprehensible; I reiterate my brother's health and welfare should have been ameliorated long ago, as should his rights.

On a separate matter, I take issue with your colleague Mr C [REDACTED] N [REDACTED] and his vexatious and slanderous claim to my G.P surgery stating I have a mental health issue.

Since said injurious claim, I requested and attended a mental health assessment which concluded no evidence of any mental health disorder, as such, I insist Herefordshire Council provides a formal written apology without delay and within the next ten days, or I shall seek redress.

Further, when I reported the events our CCTV captured regarding a supplied paid carer, Mr Nu [REDACTED] refused to view the evidence, having more interested in our CCTV recording system than the distressing incidents it caught; his lack of knowledge of the law in this area evident.

Since receiving a letter stating Mr N [REDACTED]'s removal as my mother's social worker and Mr A [REDACTED] S [REDACTED], formerly appointed as my social worker, to date, we have had no contact with the claimed yet unknown newly delegated social workers.

Lastly, I have never given consent for Herefordshire Council to share my health or social care information with other parties, and regarding the incident of Mr S [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] sharing false information concerning my personal data on my brother's DoLS documentation, I shall consider taking the matter further and to The Information Commissioner's Office.

A copy of this communication will also be sent via tracked post, I welcome an early reply.
