Dear Mr Vickers,

Due to your punitive restrictions and treatment, I recently wrote to councillors on 27th July asking for them to forward my letter, dated 25th June 2020 to you. A letter regarding the safe return of property & the detailed police report that Herefordshire Council social care staff claims to hold.

Although distressing enough to deal with a director of social care who wilfully ignored concerns and incidents and blocked communications. I now insist you handle this matter personally and promptly, and that you, as the nominated individual for Adults & Wellbeing, cease to avoid accountability and responsibility for yours and your colleague actions, inactions and libellous accusations.

On 3rd Augst 2020, I received a letter written by Ms M , one of your colleagues who conspired to fabricate criminal offences against me and assisted in concealing the extended and recurring neglect and ill-treatment of my brother by Priory Group staff; of which you were informed.

Ms M  declared only a 'computer stack and keyboard' are in Herefordshire Council social care possession. Implying item your staff took are missing, and further, that you are unable to send them to my solicitor due to the 'possibility of damage'.

Ms M  also claimed the detailed police report, which was declared to exist at a meeting with Herefordshire Council legal representatives, social care staff, including Ms M  and other legal representatives present, is attached to the letter.

Such is entirely untrue. I received only four sheets of A4 paper, one of which was blank, and others containing three random images (reduced copy attached) which they relied upon as evidence for a disturbing and distressing erroneous safeguarding report.

Therefore, I once again insist the claimed detailed police report is sent to the solicitor I previously requested in my letter of 25th June 2020.

Additionally, I remind you of your legal obligation to ensure property taken by a local authority must be kept safely, securely and returned in the condition it was taken; and at your cost.

As such, I emphasise the missing items should be located and returned, along with the 'computer stack and keyboard', via a secure courier delivery service, with itemised list and confirmation of such provided to me.

I will consider the possibility of having the computer equipment safely delivered locally via a reliable delivery service. However, such must be guaranteed to include all listed items excluding the detailed police report, which as mentioned, I require sent to the solicitor I previously requested.

A signed written declaration that the desktop PC hard drive has not been tampered with, altered or modified since it was taken by Herefordshire Council social care staff, is also required.

While I could cite specific legislation and regulations, as a person who has lectured and claims to specialise in law, I believe you are likely acquainted with them.

I look forward to hearing the detailed police report has been sent and received by my solicitor, and from you directly regarding the declaration and proposed arrangements for delivery of the computer equipment.
