Thank you for your email of 9 March 2023. As an independent regulator the ICO does not work on behalf of organisations or individuals and we have investigated your complaint to the extent appropriate, in line with our remit in section 165 of the Data Protection Act. We are not a court, the police or an ombudsman service so do not investigate in the same way in which they would do as this is not in our remit.

The evidence you provided was sufficient for an outcome to be provided about your complaint and I have explained the next steps should you wish to take them. Thank you for your somewhat evasive response email of 6th March 2023.

Essentially the outcome of the case remains undecided. Therefore as you are the ICO's representative currently handling the complaint, I ask for the following once again.

Please detail what evidence you need regarding the covert directed surveillance besides the already provided proof of dates, information of searches, data collection and sharing of my sites content (while blocked) and social media over at least the past five years, and admittance of investigation without lawful authorisation by Herefordshire Council which would as you say 'categorically indicate' Herefordshire Council flouted or violated DPA or RIPA.
